Applicant must:

- Thrive working within a team as well as independently
- Be passionate about regenerative farming, good food, and being a steward to the land
- Enjoy being outside
- Be a organized, efficient, and tidy worker
- Be highly resourceful, creative and self-directed

Working Conditions:

- The farm is exposed to all weather conditions including sun, heat and wind
- This is a highly physical and mentally demanding role. Physical requirements include standing, sitting, kneeling, bending, squatting and walking in all weather for 4 7 hours per day
- Must be able to lift and carry 50 lbs

Responsibilities:

- Support of the day to day operations of seeding, potting up, transplanting, fertilizing, pruning, weeding, irrigation, prepping beds, harvesting, washing and packing produce for sale
- Assisting with selling and promoting every week (Good Food Box/CSA program, direct sales and other)
- Help with accurate record keeping of seeding dates, planting dates, harvest records, nutrient application, and manure management
- Assisting with public/student volunteers and farm camps on site

- Be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person whom refugee protection has been conferred under Immigration and Refugee Protection Act

- Term: Onboarding will start late June/early July 2024. This is a 6-8 week position and flexible based on the needs of the successful candidate.
- Hours per week: Somewhat flexible, but need to work a minimum of 30 hours, max 40 per week. Wage: \$18-\$19 per hour, based on experience.
