101 DEVELOP SUSTAINABLE + INCLUSIVE FOOD SYSTEMS



Goal: Advance sustainable food systems through a thriving local food culture, diverse food assets, and accessible and abundant foodlands.

Objectives:

- Develop new and sustain existing community gardens within the District of Squamish and Squamish Lillooet Regional District Area D.
- Sustain existing school garden programs and expand school garden programs to Squamish Elementary and St'a7mes schools.
- Ensure financial self sustainability for the Downtown School Farm project and complete phase two and three of vision.
 - Phase two: Indigenous Garden Build (complete) and plan celebration (spring 2025)
 - Phase three: Design and build south side gardens of school farm with and for the Squamish Elementary school garden program and general public.
- Increase varied, resilient and locally-adapted seed stock through the Squamish Seed Library, Seedy Saturday events and seed saving workshops.
- Provide 6-12 food preservation and garden workshops annually.



Squamish Valley Agriculture Plan (SVAP)

Implement ongoing, medium and high priorities in partnership with support from District of Squamish and Squamish Lillooet Regional District, (Area D).

Goal 1: Expand and Encourage Agriculture and Food Production

- Host quarterly Squamish food policy council meetings.
- SVAP 1.1 Continue to support and facilitate land-linking programs locally.
- SVAP 1.2 Identify opportunities and locations for enhancing land access for agriculture initiatives and determine the feasibility of a community farmland trust for the Squamish Valley.
- SVAP 1.3 Deepen dialogue with Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw
 (Squamish Nation) on foodlands and agricultural activities.

Goal 2: Improve Sector Growth and Market Viability

- SVAP 2.1 Implement Squamish Lillooet Food Hub project.
- **SVAP 2.4** Support local procurement initiatives.

Goal 3: Promote Stewardship of Natural Resources and Regenerative Agricultural Practices

- SVAP 3.1 Continue to encourage policies and practices for maintaining and increasing pollinator health.
- **SVAP 3.5** Encourage regenerative agricultural practices.

Goal 6: Increase Engagement, Communication, Awareness, and Education

- **SVAP 6.1** Continue maintenance of the Regional Food Asset Map.
- SVAP 6.2 Work with Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw (Squamish Nation) to integrate Indigenous food system and resource management perspectives and knowledge within food plans and initiatives.
- SVAP 6.4 Facilitate educational workshops for farms and agrifood businesses.

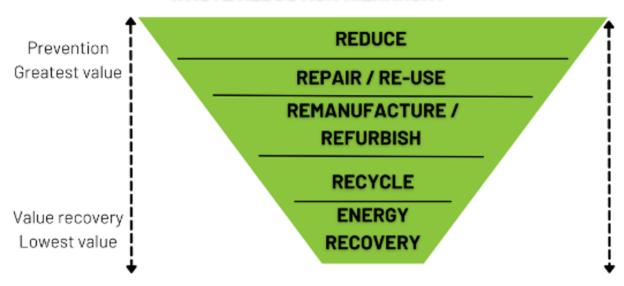
